## HELPFUL TIPS

- Requires a separate computer to borrow ebooks.
- Requires Adobe Digital Editions be installed on the computer and registered with an Adobe ID. (<https://accounts.adobe.com>)
- Ebooks will be downloaded first to computer then transferred via USB to the device (Even if the device is WiFi capable).
- Select the EPUB ebooks.

## HELPFUL TIPS

- Requires a separate computer to borrow ebooks.
- Most of the process will happen on the Overdrive site. Then you will be transferred to amazon to complete the transfer.
- Ebooks will be transferred over wifi by the Kindle. "Sync & Check for new items" if the ebook does not appear.
- Select Kindle ebooks.

Overdrive READ - Use the device browser to navigate to GCPL's ebook collection. After finding a title, use Overdrive READ to view the book in the web browser – no App needed!
